### Government allows problem schools to take up free camera surveillance trial

The Department for Education is allowing schools to trial state-of-the-art<sup>1</sup> surveillance equipment in a crackdown<sup>2</sup> on pupils dealing and taking drugs on their premises<sup>3</sup>.

However, in contrast to conventional CCTV cameras, parents and teachers are able to watch live feeds<sup>4</sup> across dozens of the IP (internet protocol) cameras set up in classrooms, corridors and playgrounds to keep tabs<sup>5</sup> on schoolchildren's behaviour.

Schools have been given the freedom to choose for themselves on whether to<sup>6</sup> trial the

system after the Department for Education said it does not have the authority to make a countrywide decision.

### Walpole students petition against school surveillance cameras

WALPOLE—A group of students is protesting the administration's proposal for more security cameras at Walpole High School, saying they're unnecessary, too expensive, and an invasion of privacy.

Calling themselves Students Opposing Surveillance, or SOS, the teens are circulating petitions—they had collected about 500 signatures as of early this week—and have met with the School Committee and school officials to argue their case.

The cameras proposed for the high school hallways are "an unwarranted invasion of our privacy in a place that is supposed to be a supportive environment of learning; it creates a feeling of distrust between the students and the administrators," said senior Sean Herlihy, who helped organize the protest campaign.

The students' opposition is bucking the trend<sup>2</sup>, both locally and nationally, in favor of putting more cameras in schools. More than 60 percent of public schools reported using security cameras in 2010, according to the national Center for Education Statistics. Less than 20 percent used cameras in 2000, the center reported.
