HERO

- 1. a. a mythological or legendary figure often endowed with great strength or ability
- **b.** a person admired for his/her achievements, noble qualities and great courage
- 2. the main character in a literary or dramatic work, an event, period, or movement
- 3. an object of extreme admiration and devotion: icon / role model

MYTH

- 1. an ancient story about gods, heroes and magic
- 2. a. popular belief or tradition embodying the ideals and institutions of a society
- b. an unfounded or false notion
- 3. a theme or character type embodying an idea

Myth (n.) $[mi\theta]$: a traditional story concerning the early history of a people or explaining a natural or social phenomenon, and typically involving supernatural beings or events.

Hero (n.) ['hɪərəu]: in mythology and folklore, a person of superhuman qualities who is admired for his/her courage or outstanding achievements.

Exchange (n.) [iks'tfeind3]: act of giving and receiving something else in return.

EXCHANGE / FLOW

- 1. a continuous output (production)
- 2. a continuous movement or circulation. All types of exchanges: people, trade, media, etc.
- 3. a general movement or tendency

Power (n.) [pauə]: a right or an authority given or delegated to a person or a body.

POWER

- 1. the ability or official capacity to exercise control, authority (the State, the government, political organization)
- 2. strength or force exerted or capable of being exerted; might (puissance)
- 3. a person, group, or nation having great influence or control over others

Progress (n.) ['praugres]: development towards a better, more complete, or more modern condition.

PROGRESS

- 1. forward movement advance development
- 2. gradual betterment; especially: the progressive development of humankind
